- 6. General Business and Reports
 - 6.1 Heritage Register Subcommittee Update

David Johnson advised that the Heritage Register Subcommittee met throughout the summer recess.

Margaret Clayton advised that the Heritage Register Subcommittee reviewed the existing Municipal Heritage Register and properties of interest with a similar calibre to the Flaherty House (John Thompson House). Ms. Clayton stated that the Subcommittee drafted a 'wish list' "List" of high priority properties for designation. She further stated that several properties were dropped from the List and would need to be readded. She suggested that the Committee postpone reinstating the Municipal Heritage Register, which would include properties from the revised List, until February 2025.

Discussion ensued regarding:

- the minimum criteria required to add a property to the Municipal Heritage Register;
- notification requirements for adding a property to the Municipal Heritage Register;
- the process for designating a property and the length of time the Municipal Heritage Register would be in effect;
- ensuring the process of reinstating the Municipal Heritage Register follows the procedures outlined in the legislation; and,

reviewing a property of interest located at 665 Taunton Road West.

A question and answer period ensued regarding:

- whether approving, suspending, and reinstating the Municipal Heritage Register and List would require Council approval; and,
- whether the Committee would have an opportunity to review a
 potential future Staff Report to Council pertaining to the
 reinstatement of the Municipal Heritage Register.






Stage 1: The Framework - 2021

A fair share of the remaining global GHG emissions was identified for Whitby ('the carbon budget').




Zero Carbon Whitby Targets

- To remain within the budget of 62, 653 tonnes, Zero Carbon Whitby embeds short, medium, and long-term greenhouse gas(GHG) reduction targets (below 2019 levels) of:
 - -20 percent by 2025
 - -40 percent by 2030
 - -100 percent by 2045



Stage 2: The Costing Study - 2022

Purpose





Key Results

Reduces emissions by 75% by 2045, with options to reach 100%

Reduces total energy use by 63% by 2045.

Requires \$63.7 million investment.

Returns \$75.3 million savings and avoided costs.

Return of \$1.66 for every \$1 invested.



Installation of low flow water fixtures across various facilities.



Building Envelope upgrades such as roof replacements with high insulation, energy efficient windows installation and weatherstripping.



Installation of Solar photovoltaic systems at Town Hall



Implementation of building monitoring and analysis systems



2023 Carbon Emissions savings

• Total estimated GHG emissions savings resulting from these projects is 318,900 KgCO2e.

This is equivalent to greenhouse gas emissions from: 71 gasoline-powered passenger vehicles driven for one year 817,516 miles driven by an average gasoline-powered passenger vehicle (?) This is equivalent to CO_2 emissions from: 35,884 gallons of gasoline consumed (?) number of smartphones charged (?) 38,791,840 This is equivalent to carbon sequestered by: 5,273 tree seedlings grown for 10 years (?)
